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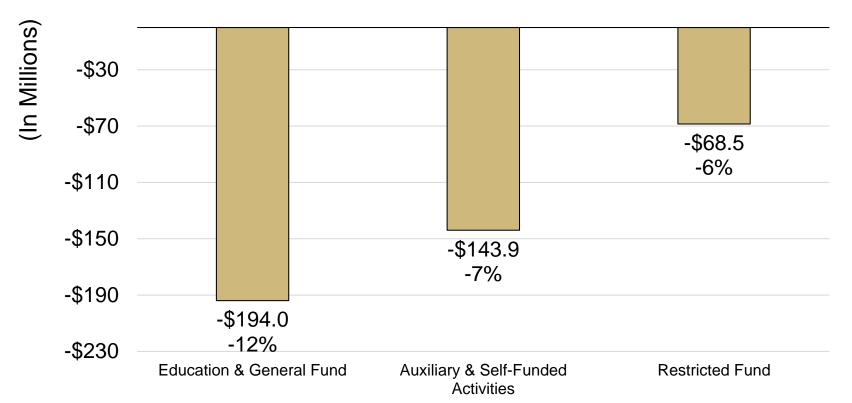
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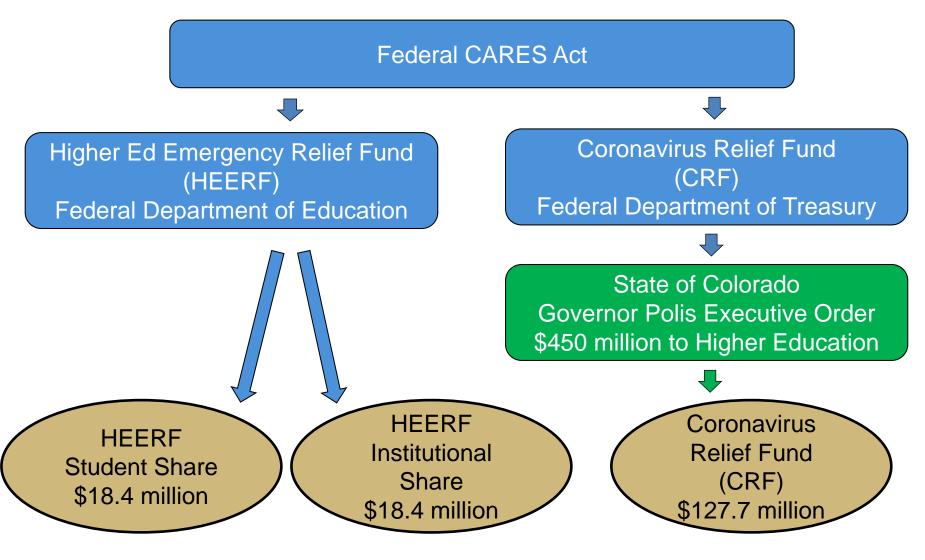

\$166 million CARES Act Funding to CU



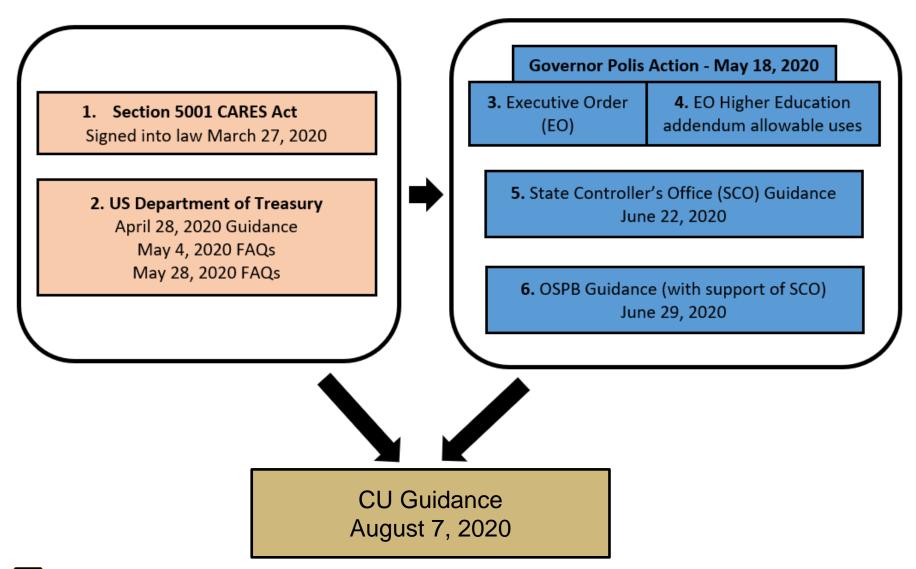

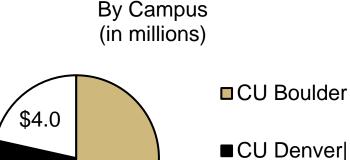

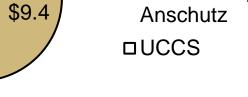

\$18.4 million HEERF Student Share

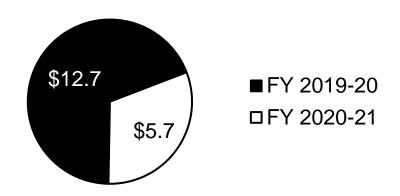
- Emergency financial aid award process at each campus

By Fiscal Year (in millions)

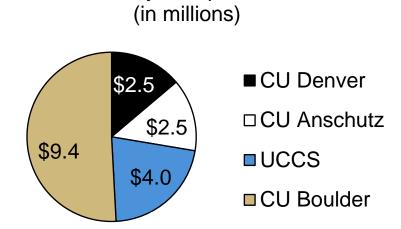

HEROES Act

State and Local Governments:

- \$500 billion to state governments
- \$375 billion to counties/municipalities
- \$30.8 billion to tribal and territorial governments, Washington D.C.
- CARES Act fix "make up revenue losses"

Education:

- \$90 billion K-12 & public postsecondary
- \$10.15 billion for colleges and universities
- \$10,000 debt relief on all federal student loans

HEALS Act

State and Local Governments:

CARES Act fix "make up revenue losses"

Education:

- \$70 billion for K-12
- \$29 billion for colleges and universities
- \$6 billion for Governor grants
- Cap student loan repayment at 10% of income
